call away - to ask sb to stop
what they are doing and go
somewhere else

She was called away from the meeting to take an urgent phone call.

clear away To tidy up, to wiremove mess or obstacles from a place to make it neat ازال. To leave, disappear The showers should **clear away** tomorrow.

die away If something, especially a sound, dies away, it gradually becomes reduced until it stops existing or disappears: يموت بعيدا

The sound of his footsteps gradually **died away**.

fade away - To lose تتلاشی strength, become weaker The voices became louder and closer and then **faded away** again. As the years passed, the memories **faded away**.

**gamble away** to lose something by gambling:

In recent years, he **gambled away** nearly \$126 million in Las Vegas casinos.

- to give something to يُتِبرع someone without asking for payment:

**give away** - To make a gift of I didn't like that book, so I **gave it** away. he shop is **giving away** a sample pack to every customer. Nobody wants this type of heater any more - I can't even give it away

get away -To move away (from).

**Get away** from the edge of the cliff! Get away from me! Surround the bank! Don't let the robber **get away!** I almost caught the critter, but it got away from me

go away - Command asking someone to leave them alone to spend time somewhere else, usually for a holiday: ابتعد أو ارحل **Go away** and leave me alone! We usually **go away** for the summer. He goes away on business a lot.

pass away - To die

After a long battle with cancer, the professor passed away yesterday.

pull away - To move ahead

انطلق

Schumacher is beginning to **pull away** from the rest of the racers.

put away To place out of the way, clean up. وضعه في مكانه المألوف

Please **put away** the tools when you are finished. I **put** the clothes **away** so as to neaten the room.

scare away - to make someone so worried about doing something that they decide not to do it:اخافة

If you charge as much as that, you'll scare customers away.

**send away** To dismiss from one's presence. To send to a particular place for a long time, as a family member, an employee, etc.

ارسال بعيدا

The salesman was taking up too much time with his nonsense, so I **sent** him **away**.

We are going to **send** our son **away** to live with his uncle in America for a year.

stow away - to hide in a ship, plane, etc. in order to travel secretly

At the age of 13 he had **stowed away** on a ship bound for Rio.

take away To remove something and put it in a different place.

To remove something,

Mother **took** our plates **away** and came back with some fruit for us to eat.

he teacher **took** my mobile phone **away** until the end of the lesson. The new law will **take away** some important rights from immigrant residents.

throw away

To discard To waste

He wanted to **throw away** the cup, but he couldn't find a trash can. Don't **throw** the newspaper **away**, it goes in the recycle bin!

The team **threw away** its chance at the semifinals.

come across - to make a particular impression.

To meet or find sb/sth by التقي مصادفة chance

She comes across well in interviews.

I hoped she'd come across with some more information.

get across Communicate successfully

بحصل عير

I just couldn't **get** my message **across** at the meeting.

crowd around to come together closely in a crowd around someone or something:

الحشد حول

As soon as he appeared, reporters crowded around.

fool around - to engage in تحامق frivolous behaviour to waste time

Don't fool around with matches.

get around To move to the other side of an obstruction.

It might be a while before we can **get** around from this traffic jam. There's no trail going through. We can't get around to the lake.

hang around - to stay, linger or loiter

If you **hang around** after the show, you can meet the cast.

look around - to visit a place or building, walking around it to see what is there.

Let's look around the town this afternoon.

We are looking around for a house in this area.

shop around - To actively search and compare options before making a selection or choice of vendor

She's **shopping around** for a new dress.
