

phrasal verbs with **away**, **across** and **around**

Verb and meaning	Example(s)
back away (intransitive) To move in a direction opposite where one is facing, keeping some تراجع	She saw that he had a gun and backed away .
blaze away to fire (firearms) repeatedly	The gunners began to blaze away at the target.
break away - to leave suddenly فر , انفصل	He grabbed her, but she managed to break away .

call away - to ask sb to stop what they are doing and go somewhere else. استدعاء

She was called away from the meeting to take an urgent phone call.

clear away To tidy up, to remove mess or obstacles from a place to make it neat. أزال
To leave, disappear

The showers should **clear away** tomorrow.

die away If something, especially a sound, dies away, it gradually becomes reduced until it stops existing or disappears: يموت بعيدا

The sound of his footsteps gradually **died away**.

fade away - To lose تتلاشى strength, become weaker

The voices became louder and closer and then **faded away** again. As the years passed, the memories **faded away**.

gamble away to lose something by gambling: مقامرة

In recent years, he **gambled away** nearly \$126 million in Las Vegas casinos.

give away - To make a gift of
- to give something to **يتبرع**
someone without asking for
payment:

I didn't like that book, so I **gave it** away.
The shop is **giving away** a sample pack to
every customer. Nobody wants this type of
heater any more - I can't even **give** it
away!

get away -To
move away **ابتعد**
(from).

Get away from the edge of the cliff! Get away from me!
Surround the bank! Don't let the robber **get away!** I
almost caught the critter, but it **got away** from me

go away - Command asking
someone to leave them alone
to spend time somewhere else,
usually for a holiday: **ابتعد أو ارحل**

Go away and leave me alone!
We usually **go away** for the summer.
He **goes away** on business a lot.

pass away - To die **مات**

After a long battle with cancer, the
professor **passed away** yesterday.

pull away - To move ahead
انطلق

Schumacher is beginning to **pull away**
from the rest of the racers.

<p>put away To place out of the way, clean up. وضعه في مكانه المألوف</p>	<p>Please put away the tools when you are finished. I put the clothes away so as to neaten the room.</p>
<p>scare away - to make someone so worried about doing something that they decide not to do it: اخافة</p>	<p>If you charge as much as that, you'll scare customers away.</p>
<p>send away To dismiss from one's presence. To send to a particular place for a long time, as a family member, an employee, etc. ارسال بعيدا</p>	<p>The salesman was taking up too much time with his nonsense, so I sent him away. We are going to send our son away to live with his uncle in America for a year.</p>
<p>stow away - to hide in a ship, plane, etc. in order to travel secretly يهرب</p>	<p>At the age of 13 he had stowed away on a ship bound for Rio.</p>
<p>take away To remove something and put it in a different place. أبعد To remove something,</p>	<p>Mother took our plates away and came back with some fruit for us to eat. he teacher took my mobile phone away until the end of the lesson. The new law will take away some important rights from immigrant residents.</p>

throw away

To discard

To waste

رمى

He wanted to **throw away** the cup, but he couldn't find a trash can. Don't **throw** the newspaper **away**, it goes in the recycle bin!

The team **threw away** its chance at the semifinals.

come across - to make a particular impression.

To meet or find sb/sth by chance

التقى مصادفة

She comes across well in interviews.

I hoped she'd come across with some more information.

get across Communicate successfully

يحصل عبر

I just couldn't **get** my message **across** at the meeting.

crowd around to come together closely in a crowd around someone or something:

الحشد حول

As soon as he appeared, reporters

crowded around.

fool around - to engage in frivolous behaviour

to waste time

تحامق

Don't **fool around** with matches.

get around To move to the other side of an obstruction. **التفاف**

It might be a while before we can **get around** from this traffic jam. There's no trail going through. We can't get around to the lake.

hang around - to stay, linger or loiter **تسكع**

If you **hang around** after the show, you can meet the cast.

look around - to visit a place or building, walking around it to see what is there. **ننظرونا**

Let's look around the town this afternoon.
We are looking around for a house in this area.

shop around - To actively search and compare options before making a selection or choice of vendor **قارن الأسعار**

She's **shopping around** for a new dress.
