

Phrasal verbs with **in** and **into**

Verb and meaning	Example(s)
<p>barge in To intrude; to enter or interrupt suddenly and without invitation.</p> <p>أقحم نفسه</p>	<p>What makes you think you can just barge in and make demands of the CEO?</p>
<p>break in (intransitive) To enter a place by force or illicit means.</p> <p>يقتحم</p>	<p>Someone broke in and stole his radio.</p>
<p>fill in To fill; to replace material that is absent or has been removed. To inform somebody, especially to supply someone missing or missed information.</p> <p>أملأ</p>	<p>After you're done laying the pipe, fill in the trench.</p> <p>If you know anything about this, maybe you can fill me in.</p>

butt in To join a conversation or situation in which one is not welcome or invited;

تدخل في شئون الآخرين

Hey, this is none of your business, don't **butt in!**
Forgive me for **butting in**.

check in To announce or record one's arrival at a hotel, airport etc. استدعاء

For security reasons, you have to **check in** two hours before your flight.

drop in One who arrives unannounced or without an appointment.

I was in the garden covered with mud when my grandmother **dropped in** for a visit.

join in To participate, take part or get involved in something.

انضم الى

She was too shy to **join in** the game.

fit in To be physically capable of going into a space
To be confident in a social situation

يصلح في

The plug **fits in** the socket.
The recluse did not fit in at the party.

get in To get into or inside something, literally or figuratively.

أدخل

Hurry up and **get in** the car! He tried to go after the ball but couldn't **get in** the game. You'd better **get in** gear. We've got work to do!

give in to relent, yield, surrender or admit defeat

تنازل استسلم

I finally **gave in** and let him stay up to watch TV. Stop hitting me! I **give in**! OK, I don't know the answer. I **give in**.

hand in To give something to a responsible person.

يُدا بيد

I found a wallet on the street, so I **handed it** in to the police.

<p>move in - Arrive in a new home or office</p> <p>دخل</p>	<p>You've bought a new house? When are you moving in?</p>
<p>pay in - to put money into a bank account</p> <p>دفع في</p>	<p>If you go to the bank, will you pay these cheques in for me?</p>
<p>phase in To introduce something little by little</p> <p>دخل تدريجيا</p>	<p>The government will phase in the new education system over a period of three years.</p>
<p>plug in - To connect (an electrical device) to a plug socket.</p> <p>وصل بالقابس الكهربائي</p>	<p>Can you plug in the hairdryer for me?</p>
<p>pop in To visit in an impromptu manner.</p> <p>دخل فجأة</p>	<p>Why don't you pop in and see us this afternoon?</p>

pull in To pull something, so that comes inside.

After falling out of the boat, the crew **pulled him in**.

send in - to send something to an organization

بعث

The magazine asked its readers to **send in** their comments about the new style of presentation.

settle in To get comfortable or established, as in a new place.

تسوية في

I had just sat down in my favorite easy chair and **settled in** when the phone rang.

show in - to make someone seem to be a bad person

تظهر في

He was concerned that the film had **shown him in** a bad light.

sink in - Become clear in one's mind.

He knows he's been naughty, but it will take a while for it to **sink in**.

stay in - to stay in your home

البقاء في

Let's **stay in** tonight and watch a movie.

take in - Allow to stay in one's home - Note with your eyes and register - Understand what one sees, hears or reads / realize what is happening.

ضم

To deceive; to hoodwink.

خدع

She's always **taking in** stray cats and dogs!

She **took in** every detail of her rival's outfit.

The man immediately **took in** the scene and called the police

tune in - to watch or listen to a particular television or radio programme or station

وجه الراديو

Be sure to **tune in** to next week's show. Millions of viewers tune in every weekday for 'News at Night'.

break into To enter illegally or by force, especially in order to commit a crime.

اقتحم

Somebody **broke into** his car and stole his tools and CDs.

bump into - to collide with.

تصطدم

He **bumped into** the wall. I guess that's a risk you take when you read while walking.

burst into - cry
بكي بكاء شديدا
to enter a room or building suddenly and without warning

اقتحم

Mary **burst into** tears when she saw her little daughter.

The side door of the pub flew open and three men **burst in**.

come into - To inherit (money).

حيز

After his father died, he **came into** a large fortune.

dig into - 1) Try to find deep inside something. 2) Start to do something. 3) Take from something.
حفر في

1) He **dug into** his pocket and found a coin. 2) It was time to **dig into** the work that had accumulated on her desk. 3) Dad had to **dig into** his savings to repair the roof.

look into to investigate, explore,
or consider

أنعم النظر

If you are buying a new car, you might
want to **look into** getting a hybrid or
other high-efficiency vehicle.

run into To enter by running.
To collide with.

اصطدم

He **ran into** the building.

He lost control of the vehicle and **ran
into** a tree.

talk into - Persuade someone to
do something

التحدث إلى

He's against the idea, but I think I can
talk him **into** it.

turn into To transform into;
become. تحول الى , أصبح

The carriage **turned into** a pumpkin
at midnight.
