

Three-part phrasal verbs

Verb and meaning	Example(s)
<p>carry on with - to continue doing sth.</p> <p>الاستمرار في</p>	<p>Carry on with your work while I am away. After he left I just tried to carry on as usual.</p>
<p>catch up with - Reach the same stage as someone else.</p> <p>اللاحق</p>	<p>I've missed some classes so I'll have to work hard to catch up with the others.</p>
<p>come down with - Become ill with</p> <p>ينزل مع , يمرض</p>	<p>The architect planned to attend the inauguration but unfortunately he came down with the flu over the weekend.</p>

come in for - to receive blame or criticism

استلم العديد من النقد

The director has **come in for** a lot of criticism over his handling of the affair.

come out in -If you come out in something, such as spots, they appear on your skin-

تخرج في

This heat has made me **come out in** an itchy red rash.

come up against - Be faced with or opposed by.

نصطدم

The project **came up against** a lot of criticism.

come up with - Produce an idea or plan

ياتي بكرة

Sacha **came up with** a great idea for the party.

cut down on - Reduce in number or size.

خفض

The doctor told him to **cut down on** cigarettes.

do away with - Get rid of; abolish

تخلص من, ألغى

Some people think it's time to **do away with** the monarchy.

face up to - Accept and deal with something unpleasant

مواجهة

Sam will have to **face up to** the fact that Jenny is not in love with him.

feel up to - to have the energy to do something

لدي الطاقة لعمل شيء ما

I don't **feel up to** going out tonight.

get along with - Be on good terms / work well with

انسجم مع

I **get along** (well) **with** my mother-in-law.

get away with - to succeed in avoiding punishment for something - Escape with

تفلت من العقاب

If I thought I could **get away with** it, I wouldn't pay any tax at all.

<p>get down to - Start to actually do something</p>	<p>It's time to get down to some serious work!</p>
<p>get on with - Have a good relationship with</p> <p>رضى</p>	<p>I get on very well with my colleagues.</p>
<p>get out of -- Leave</p> <p>الخروج من</p>	<p>How did he get out of the house?</p>
<p>get rid of - to remove or throw away something unwanted -to sell an old or unwanted possession - to send away someone annoying or to persuade them to leave Eliminate</p> <p>تخلص من</p>	<p>That cream got rid of my skin rash. I used weedkiller to get rid of the weeds in the garden. Have you managed to get rid of your old Volvo yet?</p> <p>We got rid of our unwelcome guests by saying we had to go to bed.</p>
<p>get round to - Find the necessary time to do something</p> <p>الحصول على جولة للقيام بذلك</p>	<p>I finally got round to making the list that I promised.</p>
