

Three-part phrasal verbs

Verb and meaning	Example(s)
<p>get up to - to do something, often something that other people would disapprove of</p> <p>الحصول على ما يصل إلى</p>	<p>She's been getting up to all sorts of mischief lately. I wonder what those two got up to yesterday?</p>
<p>go ahead with - to begin to do something, especially when sb has given permission</p> <p>المضي قدما</p>	<p>'May I start now?' Yes, go ahead.' The government intends to go ahead with its tax cutting plans.</p>
<p>go along with - Agree with; accept.</p> <p>الذهاب جنبا إلى جنب مع</p>	<p>Alex tends to go along with anything his wife says.</p>

go on with - to continue an activity, especially after a pause or break

المضي قدما مع

That's enough for now - let's **go on with** it tomorrow.

go through with - to do what is necessary to complete a course of action

من خلال الذهاب مع

She decided not to **go through with** the operation.

grow out of - to be become too big to fit into pieces of clothing - to stop doing sth as you become older.

تنمو من

He's already **grown out of** his school uniform.

Most children suck their thumbs but they **grow out of** it.

hold on to - to keep sth that is an advantage for you


تمسك ب

You should hold on to your oil shares.
She took an early lead in the race and held on to it for nine laps.

keep up with - Stay at the same level as someone or something

مواكبة

Bill walks so fast it's difficult to **keep up with** him.



live up to - to do as well as or be as good as other people expect you to.

He failed to **live up to** his parents' expectations.
The team called 'The No-Hoppers' certainly lived up to its name.

look down on - Consider as inferior

ترفع

He tends to **look down on** anyone who is not successful.

look up to - Admire

احترم

He was a wonderful teacher and many students **looked up to** him.

miss out on - Lose an opportunity to do something.

خسر

If you leave before Saturday you'll **miss out on** the party.

put up with - Tolerate

تحمل

I don't know how you can **put up with** all the noise.

<p>run out of - Have no more of something</p> <p>نفاد</p>	<p>What a nuisance! I've run out of coffee.</p>
<p>send away/off for - to write to sb and ask them to send you sth by post.</p> <p>ارسال بعيدا ل</p>	<p>I've sent off for some books for my course.</p>
<p>settle up with - to pay someone the money that you owe them.</p> <p>تسوية مع</p>	<p>Would you like to settle up now, sir? You buy the tickets and I'll settle up with you later.</p>
<p>walk out on - to suddenly leave your husband, wife or partner and end your relationship with them.</p> <p>تخلي</p>	<p>He walked out on his wife and two kids.</p>
<p>write away/off for - to write a letter to an organisation asking them to send you something.</p> <p>ارسال بعيدا ل</p>	<p>Did you write off for tickets?</p>
