

## phrasal verbs with look

Verb and meaning	Example(s)
<b>look after</b> <i>someone/something</i> - take care of يعتنى	I have to <b>look after</b> my sick grandmother. He is perfectly capable of <b>looking after</b> himself.
<b>look down on</b> <i>someone</i> - think less of, consider inferior يحتقر	Ever since we stole that chocolate bar your dad has <b>looked down on</b> me.

**look for**

*someone/something* - try to find.  
يبحث

I'm **looking for** a red dress for the wedding.

**look forward to something**

- be excited about the future  
يتطلع

I'm **looking forward to** the Christmas break.

**look into something** - investigate  
ينظر, يتحقق

We are going to **look into** the price of snowboards today.

**look out** - be careful, vigilant, and take notice  
انتبه, احذر

**Look out!** That car's going to hit you!

Verb and meaning	Example(s)
<p><b>look out for</b>  <i>someone/something</i> - be especially vigilant for <b>احترس</b></p>	<p>Don't forget to <b>look out for</b> snakes on the hiking trail.</p>
<p><b>look something over</b> - check, examine</p>	<p>Can you <b>look over</b> my essay for spelling mistakes?</p>
<p><b>look something up</b> - search and find information in a reference book or database</p>	<p>We can <b>look</b> her phone number <b>up</b> on the Internet.</p>
<p><b>look up to</b> <i>someone</i> - have a lot of respect for <b>يحترم</b></p>	<p>My little sister has always <b>looked up</b> to me.</p>
