Explanations

Here are some examples of time words we use when we are talking about the future:

- *tomorrow*

I'm leaving for France tomorrow.

- *next week*

I'll see you at the meeting next week.

- *soon*

Goodbye! I'll see you soon.

- *later, after*

I'll phone you later.

(no object)

I'll phone you after the film.

(object)

- *in a moment, etc.*

I'll be back in a moment.

I'll see you in two weeks.

- *at (+ the time)*

I'll be back at 6.00.
