

at home, at work, at school

Mary is at school.

(We don't know which classroom.)

She isn't at home.

Mr King was at work yesterday.

(We don't know where exactly.)

Examples

The bus stopped at the train station.

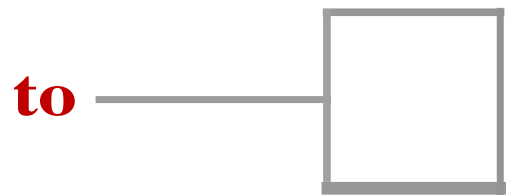
My sister isn't at work. She's at the doctor's.

My garden is at the back of the house.

Wait for me at the crossroads.

to

We use **to** when we talk about movement.



Last night we went to the cinema.

I went to the cinema last night.

Are you coming to the party?

David brought his dog to school.

Tina took her sister to the circus.

Examples

- We do not use **to** with *home*.

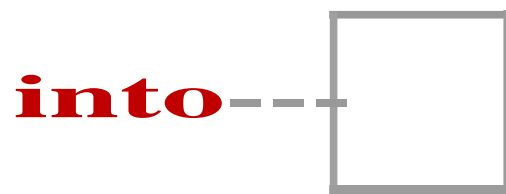
I have to go home now.

- We do not use **to** with *here* or *there*.

Sam is coming here tomorrow.

into

We use **into** when we talk about moving from the outside to the inside.



Tom ran into the room and sat down.

The children climbed into the car.

I went into the shop.
