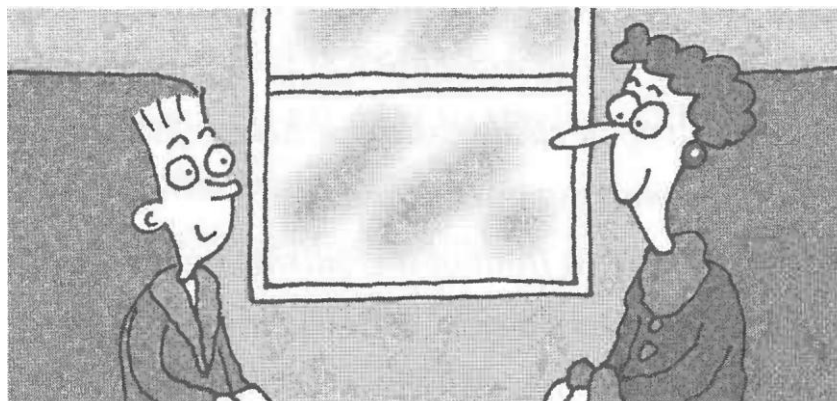


opposite

We use **opposite** when we talk about things or people that are on the other side, exactly.

*There is a school **opposite** my house.*



*The boy is sitting **opposite** his mother.*

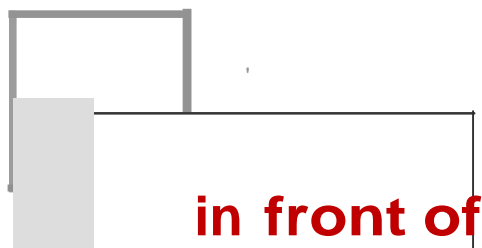
out of

We use *out of* when we talk about moving from the inside to the outside.

*Helen ran **out of** the room.*

in front of

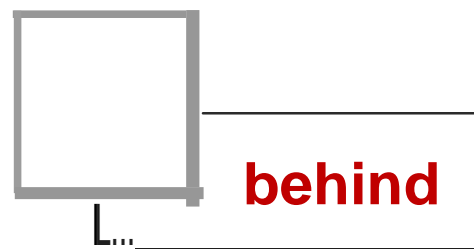
in front of means **before** someone or something.



*Helen sits **in front of** me.*

*The motorbike is **in front of** the car.*

behind



behind means *after* someone or something.

*David was **behind** me. Anna sits **behind** me.*
