### Explanations

#### Subject pronouns

<i>I</i>	<i>he</i>	<i>we</i>
<i>you</i>	<i>she</i>	<i>they</i>
	<i>it</i>	

These come before the main verb:

*I think it's awful.*

*Do you like this film?*

#### Object pronouns

<i>me</i>	<i>him</i>	<i>us</i>
<i>you</i>	<i>her</i>	<i>them</i>
	<i>it</i>	

These come after the main verb:

*I sent them a letter.*

*Ellen told us the answer.*

#### Possessive pronouns

<i>mine</i>	<i>his</i>	<i>ours</i>
<i>yours</i>	<i>hers</i>	<i>theirs</i>
	<i>its</i>	

*Is this pen yours or mine?*

- No apostrophe before **s** with possessive pronouns.

#### *this* and *that*

<i>singular</i>	<i>this</i>	<i>that</i>
<i>plural</i>	<i>these</i>	<i>those</i>

We use **this** and **these** when we talk about things which are here. We use **that** and **those** when we talk about things which are there.

*What's this?* (The thing in my hands)

*I'd those, please.* (The things in your hands)

#### With nouns

*These shoes are nice. Is that blue car yours?*

#### *one* / *ones*

*I like that one.*

*I don't like the blue ones.*

*'Did you buy a loaf?' 'I bought a small one.' That was a nice biscuit. Can I have another one?*
